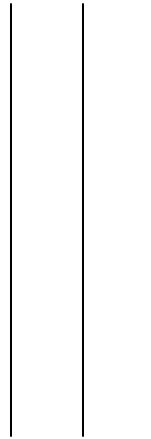
## Volunteer Opportunities

Administrative and auxiliary members are primarily involved in community outreach, business management and fundraising activities.

Operation volunteers serve at all ranks of the department from firefighter to command officer. Personnel can be cross-trained as an emergency medical technician (EMT) and firefighter or as an EMT only. Advancement opportunities are available for volunteers desiring to become driver-operators, fire officers, paramedics, and EMS officers.

Administrative and auxiliary members provide essential support services for the volunteer companies. People with skills in fundraising, community education, and business and personnel management are especially needed.
