- Mutual Automatic Aide Agreement signed with Frederick County – limits number of units per call.
- Operational Medical Director Contract signed – Dr. Chris Turnbull.

Office of the Fire Marshal

- 80 fire inspections
 - 5 complaints resolved
 - 82 plans/site reviews completed
 - 2,943 children and adults were presented over 12,000 hours of Fire Prevention Education.
 - 109 fire related incidents – 22 were arson related
 - \$121,650 total fire damage
 - 23 hazardous use permits
 - 15 blasting related
 - 8 fireworks related
- Fire Prevention Week – kick-off October 6, 2008 – “Prevent Home Fires”

Grants.

- FY2007 Assistance to Firefighters Grant/Fitness Equipment = \$98,503.68 - \$10,944/ strength equipment delivered and \$35,200 of cardio equipment on order for volunteer stations
- VDFP Burn Building Grant = \$30,700 - work being conducted – Frederick County Volunteer Fire & Rescue Association has approved \$20,000 to assist with repairs.
- 2008 RSAF Grant/12-LEAD Defibrillators ordered – 45 to 60 days for delivery - \$98,546.90
- VDEM Hazmat Team Equipment and Training Grant - \$130,000
